Detailed course description

The course aims to introduce micro-and macro-economic processes of the regional economies with a special focus on the spatial processes of intra and interregional economic flows and on the nodes of the spatial economies. It discusses the related theoretical models and methods of analysis. Within the framework of regional microeconomics it discusses fundamental problems of location theories and the several location factors determining the location site selection decisions of the firms. It presents the competitive advantages of local business and industrial concentrations, agglomerations and regional cluster formations (benefits of agglomeration effects) and local business networks. The second part of the course regional macroeconomics examines issues of economic growth and development, the interregional flow-processes of the economy (migration, trade).. In addition, we examine the role of technology and innovation in regional development.

addition, mastering the reading assignments and problem setting is also included in the evaluation.


